	<b>SSP Practitioners Conference-</b> The conference went well with a high attendance virtually, feedback has been requested from attendees and will be reviewed to support the planning process for next year's conference.
	<b>Right Care Right Person-</b> The partnership will be kept up to date with the progress of this after the go-live date in October.
2.	Early Update on CQC Inspection/ ASC Safeguarding Senior Leadership Updates:

Item No.	Item Description
	The CQC inspection is nearing completion with a few interviews still to be undertaken. A presentation will be compiled and presented to partners when the feedback has been received and reviewed.
	Update from all partners on upcoming winter pressures:  The plans for winter pressure monitoring are now underway within the ICB, and tactical cells are being set up to allow partners to flag pressures in the system.
	The same pressures are faced within ASC but these pressures are factored in the planning of work all year round.  It was noted that the providers may be over reporting concerns because of anxieties around compliance regarding their registration.
	A new Manager for Service Development and Contracts has been appointed and the current post holder will be moving into the role of Assistant Director for Learning Disabilities, Autism and Mental Health. The Assistant Director for Safeguarding will be filled by an interim.

7.	Safeguarding Adults Week 2023 Safeguarding Adults Week is happening 20-24 <sup>th</sup> November and is a collaboration between Norfolk and Suffolk. There is a schedule from the Ann Craft Trust for resources to be shared.
	ASC will also be planning resources for Safeguarding Adults Week, and they will link up with the SSP to coordinate this.
	The SSP will link up with partners including Police, CAS, and ASC to ensure a joined-up plan for Safeguarding Adult Week.

8.	Financial Abuse Strategy for Suffolk A Task and Finish group looking at Financial Abuse has been running for a few months now and from this some practice guidance around Financial Abuse in Suffolk is being developed. This will be presented to the LIG on 10 <sup>th</sup> October for signoff.

9.	Update on case reviews The new cases that have been referred into SARP were detailed below:
	<ul> <li>Case - this is a case of Self Neglect and Hoarding with a similar theme of lack of a timely MDT and sharing of the right information. This case will be reviewed at the next SARP.</li> <li>Case - There will be a one-off learning event looking to explore the interaction of agencies with and his wife and family.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Case — This case focuses on care quality and pathways for those in crisis when living with dementia, this is linked into the work that is being undertaken on the county dementia strategy and action plan.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>There are 8 further cases in different stages of review, 5 in action planning and 3 to be updated at the next SARP</li> </ul>
	The top themes from recent cases to be considered:
	<ul> <li>Any agency should be able to call an MDT</li> <li>Sharing of Information about risk when GDPR and concerns about data sharing are not understood</li> <li>Training - Shadowing/Buddy – to provide an insight into other agencies working, how they do their work, how they remain legal, and to encourage professional working</li> </ul>
	relationships.  • MDT - pilot in discussion with West INT and ASC to develop the process of when to call and MDT, how to develop ToR relating to MDT, and also collectively managing risk.

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	<ul> <li>MCA – ongoing and sitting in LIG for wider understanding of what needs to be done to evidence the impact of the learning from cases, and the training available through Suffolk CPD and individual organisations learning and development.</li> </ul>
10.	Sharing Good Practice The role of the VSCE in Safeguarding was explained to the Board. All partners welcomed the sharing of information and thanked her for her presentation.
